1. GENERAL

The announcement of the European Fire Sport Championships for Men, Women, and Youth is made after a decision by the CTIF International Commission for Firefighting Sports and after approval by the Executive Council of CTIF.

The competition will take place from Monday, August 17 to Sunday, August 23, 2026, in Ostrava (Czechia), under the leadership of CTIF's International Commission for Firefighting Sports.

The local organization is entrusted with the Association of Volunteer Fire Brigades of Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia in cooperation with the Regional Association of Voluntary Firefighters of the Moravian-Silesian Region and the District Association of Voluntary Firefighters of Ostrava.

The competition will take place with the support of the Ministry of the Interior – General Directorate of the Fire Rescue Service of the Czech Republic, the Governor of the Moravian-Silesian Region, and the Mayor of the City of Ostrava.

The organisation for CTIF will be led by the Chair of the International chairman of the CTIF Firefighting Sports Commission, Zdeněk Nytra.

Information on the technical implementation of the International Fire Sport Competitions can be found in the International Competition Rules for Fire Sports, with local modifications approved by the CTIF International Commission for Firefighting Sports.

2. ORGANIZATION

2.1 National Organising Team

3. COMPETITION PARTICIPANTS

The representative teams in fire sports for men, women and youth from the member countries of the International Association of Fire and Rescue Services (CTIF), as well as teams of invited countries, have the right to participate in the competition.

The sports delegation of each team may include the following members: team leader – 1; men's coach – 1; women's coach – 1; junior men's coach – 1; junior women's coach – 1; medical person/masseur – 2; judge – 1 up to 2; driver – 2; competitors: men – 10; women – 10; junior men – 9; junior women – 9.

The participants must fulfil the following requirement: **Arrange travel insurance especially including medical expenses insurance.**

3.1 Athletes Age Groups

The age of athletes is determined by the year of birth. Within one competition, each athlete may compete in only one age category.

Adults group (men and women)

- 10 members aged 18 or older (born in 2008 or earlier)

Young men and young women aged 15 to 17 are allowed to compete in adult groups with a medical certificate with written consent of the doctor and a parent or legal guardian.

Youth group (junior men and junior women)

- 9 members: 3 aged 17–18 (born in 2008–2009), 3 aged 15–16 (born in 2010–2011) and 3 aged 14 or younger (born in 2012 or later)

Competitors may enter the youth competition in an age category higher than the one corresponding to their year of birth only with the written consent of a parent or legal guardian.

4. INFORMATION ABOUT THE COMPETITION, REGISTRATION AND COSTS

4.1 Competition and disciplines

The competition under the CTIF International Competition Rules for Fire Sports, with local modifications approved by the CTIF International Commission for Firefighting Sports, in the following four disciplines:

1. Climbing on an Assault Ladder to the Training Tower
2. 100-Meter Obstacle Course
3. 4x100-Meter Fire Relay Race with Obstacles
4. Combat Deployment from a Motor Pump

The composition of the teams for **men and women** by disciplines and the number of ranking results is according to the table:

The competition in the discipline "Combat Deployment from a motor pump" will be conducted with the motor pump "**ROSENBAUER FOX IV SPORT**" and suction pipes with "STORZ" type couplings.

Local modification regarding the targets for the exercise "Combat deployment from a motor pump": The height of the shield for laying the firefighting equipment is 10 cm; the centre of the target is located 160 cm above the ground. (See Annex No. 2 – Pictorial annex to the common material)

Local modification regarding the 4th leg of the 4 x 100-meter fire relay race for youth: The portable fire extinguisher shall only be carried to the board and placed on it; no extinguishing will be performed. (Annex No. 3 – Video tutorial – portable fire extinguisher for youth 4 x 100M)

The fourth stage: The competitor on the fourth leg grabs a portable fire extinguisher and carries it to a marked spot (onto the board), where he stands up. The fire extinguisher must not fall until the competitor has run through the finish line. The minimum weight of the fire extinguisher is 5 kg, the maximum weight is 7 kg. At a distance of 50 m from the start of the fourth section (30 m from the fire extinguisher), a pad with dimensions of 0.8 × 0.8 m and a maximum thickness of 3 cm shall be placed. The surface of the pad may be coated with an adhesive material, while maintaining the specified dimensions.

4.2 Venues of the Disciplines

The disciplines of the European Fire Sport Championships will take place at the following venues:

- Climbing on an Assault Ladder to the Training Tower – Number of lanes: 4

Athletics Stadium Poruba – SAREZA, Ostrava (GPS: 49.8229969 N, 18.1789203 E):

- 100-Meter Obstacle Course – Number of lanes: 4
- 4x100-Meter Fire Relay Race with Obstacles – Number of lanes: 2
- Combat Deployment from a Motor Pump – Number of lanes: 2

4.3 Command and Command Language

All commands shall be given in the language of the host country (Czech):

„**Na místa**“ – On your marks

„**Připravte se**“ – Ready

„**Pozor**“ – Steady

„**Zpět**“ – Stand down (Dismissed)

4.3 Training

The training and disciplines schedule shall be handed over to the Team Leader upon registration. Each group shall receive an equal amount of training time.

4.4 Festive Events

The opening ceremony of the European Fire Sport Championships for Men, Women, and Youth will take place at Hlavní třída, Ostrava, and the closing ceremony will take place at the Athletics Stadium Poruba – SAREZA, Ostrava.

Each nation will carry their name plaque at the front, followed by their national flag. Both the name plaque and the national flag will be provided by the host country. The name plaque bearer is provided by the host country, and the flag bearer is provided by their own nation.

4.5 Participant Registrations and Registration Fee

The duly completed Competition Application for the National Team (Annex No. 1) must be submitted to rihova@dh.cz no later than July 31, 2026.

On-site accreditation will take place at the accommodation venue – Hotel Garni VŠB, Ostrava. Participants must present a valid ID card or passport.

The registration fee is €312 per participant, covering the full duration of the event from August 18 to August 23.

The registration fee must be paid no later than April 30, 2026.

Each participating country will receive an invoice from the organizer (Czech Republic) in accordance with the details provided in the registration form.

Transport: Each participating country is responsible for arranging and covering their own transport to and from the event.

Accommodation and meals: Accommodation and meals for all participants are provided and fully covered by the organizer (Czech Republic) for the entire duration of the event.

Meals will be served in the form of breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Catering starts with lunch on Monday and ends with breakfast on Sunday.

5. ACCOMMODATION

The national teams that have confirmed their participation within the specified period will be accommodated at the Student Dormitories of VŠB-TUO.

Check-in is available from 2:00 PM.

Vehicles and buses will be parked in the designated parking lot. Each team is required to confirm in advance the number and type of vehicles they will arrive with in order to ensure adequate parking arrangements.

The rooms are equipped with sleeping beds, toilet, and shower. Bedding is provided.

The Delegation Leader, trainers, masseur, interpreter, drivers may arrange their hotel accommodation at their own expense or at the expense of their association. The participant fee for hotel accommodation including meals is €562.

Competitors must be accommodated at the student dormitories.

Please note that the Head of Delegation always remains fully responsible for their delegation and may not transfer this responsibility to another person.

Deposit: On the day of arrival, a deposit of €200.0 per team must be paid. The deposit serves as a guarantee that all furnishings will be returned in proper and complete condition on the day of departure. The deposit will be fully refunded upon departure, provided no damage or defects are found.
